- Making sense of them and the options available can sometimes be tricky.





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


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### Graduate Job Market – "the 80% rule"

- 20% to 30% of all graduate jobs will require an essential or relevant degree subject to enter (in the areas of STEAM and some in MFL). Of the remaining 70% to 80% these can be entered via any degree due to transferable skills and experience.
  - Of these, approximately 40% to 66% of graduate recruiters, will accept any degree subject; of those who do not, they will prefer a relevant degree subject.


#### College:
