
Google Calendar for organisation






Daily summary for Year 10




2) Student 'to do' lists

- Intention this year is to begin homework assignments with "HW"




Remember to 'Mark as done' - moves item from 'to do' to 'done' list







- JCQ Joint Council for Qualifications
- Inspected every year strict criteria that we MUST comply to
- > Subject-by-subject basis NOT across all subjects automatically
- Autism/ADHD or Dyslexia, a medical diagnosis/physical condition or social, emotional & mental health itself, does not automatically entitle a student to access arrangements.
- The student will need to have been **observed** as being substantially disadvantaged in taking school tests and exams to be awarded access arrangements.

JCQ does NOT accept any scores (testing or otherwise) below Year 9
