Grammar Revision

We cannot stress enough the importance of knowing basic grammar. Here is a checklist of things for you to work on over the summer. Highlight them off when you're done!

Tenses of regular verbs	Regular verbs, in all persons-Present tense-Perfect tense-Future tense-Conditional tense
Tenses of common irregular verbs	Irregular verbs (eg: haben, sein, gehen, fahren, können, wollen, dürfen, sollen, müssen), in all persons - Present tense - Perfect tense - Future tense - Conditional tense
Other	 Adjective endings Giving and justifying your opinion Complex language including: time phrases, subordinating conjunctions (e.g. wenn, als, obwohl, weil, da), adverbs, comparatives, superlatives, negatives

Make your presentation interesting for your audience, you can include pictures, clips, webcams, youtube etc.
